We have several new members on the board, so we spent some time on presenting ourselves and the history of NYGP. We summarized the work we have done so far.

The board was informed that the specialist training statement will be the focus of a symposium at The Nordic congress in Stavanger in June, organized by The Nordic specialist training committee.

Annika invited the NYGP board members to present digitally how general practice is organised in each country at the Finnish national meeting on November 24th.

We went on to have discussions on future work in NYGP:

We had a brief discussion how young GPs/trainees are organized in each country, how they interact and receive information. This conversation and exchange of experience will need to be continued at future meetings as it is an important learning point for the NYGP.

The Finnish chairmanship that will take over in Stavanger in June presented their ideas for a new NYGP project. It was very well received and generated an inspired discussion on possible topics and angles. Here are some key words:

Young GP wellbeing. How is GP life in each country? How are practices organized? Rights as employees. Work-life balance. Quality of life of young GPs. What has recruited you to general practice? What keeps you in general practice? How are you included in your work place, in decisions? How is your work day? Satisfied doctor are important for satisfied patients and good health care. What works well? What can we learn from each other?

Kati and Annika have a thought of making a questionnaire to distribute at the Nordic congress on these topics.

The final part of the annual meeting was spent on orientation and preparation for the pre-congress, led by Ingvild. We talked about financing and fees for the pre-congress. This should be discussed again, in preparation of future pre-congresses.

The NYGP Board members will present the following from their country, 15 minutes per country:

1. How is general practice organised?
2. How is specialist training organised?
3. Which quality indicators exist for general practice in your country and how are they used?
4. In your country, what would be a good indicator for measuring the quality of GP training?
