- One national hospital serving the whole country
- Redundancy of private specialists (with exeptions) many of those work part time at the hospital
- Weak primary care 16% of medical work force are general practitioners
- No referral system or referral obligation
- Primary care centrally organised by State
- GP's on fixed salary with little influence on management
- Recruitment problems


